



Curriculum Committee Terms of Reference 2021-22

The quorum for meetings of this committee is any 4 governors who are members of the committee that can include the Head Teacher. This means 4 out of 9 members as a minimum each meeting.

The first meeting of the academic year should consider the items to be presented during the academic year.

Outcomes and Standards

- Analyse data concerning student progress paying particular attention to the progress and attainment data of identifiable groups, including those eligible for pupil premium grant funding & Year 7 catch-up funding.
- To monitor the implementation of the School Improvement Plan and the Post OFSTED Action Plan.

Quality of Teaching and Learning and Assessment

- Monitor and evaluate the quality of teaching and learning, including a review of strengths and areas for development.
- Ensure arrangements for statutory assessments and for issuing progress reports to parents are in place.

Curriculum

- Ensure that the school's curriculum offer matches the ethos of the school and meets the needs of all students.
- To review the school's aims and objectives in relation to the curriculum and make recommendations to the governing board.
- To review the curriculum development elements of the School Improvement Plan and the Post OFSTED Action Plan and to make recommendations to the governing board.
- To monitor the teaching of religious education and to consider what arrangements are in place for a daily act of collective worship.
- To monitor the teaching of sex and relationship education.
- To advise the finance committee of any priorities for expenditure in regard to learning areas.
- To review and approve the curriculum policy statement on behalf of the governing board.

Students

- To ensure that all students are given equality of access to the curriculum.
- To review times of school sessions and taught time and make recommendations to the full Governing Board.
- Review, monitor and evaluate the policies for inclusion and supporting vulnerable children with inclusion and looked after children link governors.
- Approve, review, monitor and evaluate the school's behaviour policies & procedures.
- Approve, review, monitor and evaluate the school's attendance policy & procedures.
- Monitor and evaluate the school's extra-curricular activities and educational visits programme.

- To contribute to the development of curriculum related strategies to increase parental involvement in the school.

To conduct the annual review of the curriculum committee structure and terms of reference and to make recommendations to the Governing Board.
